# **Exploring the Text**

- What was Levi's profession? How would the Jewish authority look at Levi and why? Who would he be compared to?
- ❖ What did Levi leave behind when he followed Jesus? (v.28)
- Who did Levi invite to his "new career party"? Why is this significant?
- What was the point of the Pharisees' condemnation of Jesus? Is there any scenario where their concerns or assessment would be valid? Why or Why not?
- ❖ What reason did Jesus give for his coming? What is significant about this verse? (v.32)
- What were Jesus' disciples failing to do, according to those questioning Jesus? Why was fasting so important to the conservative Jews?
- How did Jesus identify himself to those questioning him? Why is this statement significant?

# **Digging Deeper**

❖ What did Jesus mean by saying that He came to call sinners to repentance and not to call the righteous? Who are "the righteous" that don't need Jesus? How should this verse influence us as individual believers and our church?

- What do people find most difficult to leave behind when they follow Jesus?
- ❖ What kinds of dangers are created when people compare their religious customs and habits with those of other people? How do we know when differences are unimportant and when they are crucial?

# Apply It

- ❖ Do you believe your life and home/family are open to unbelievers who need Jesus? What tangible step could you take to build bridges to your lost companions?
- Why is it important to show respect for the way other Christians honor God? What would showing this respect look like?
