- ❖ What area of stewardship gives you the most difficulties?
- ❖ Who in the Bible strikes you as a faithful steward and why? Who would be faithless and why?

Digging Deeper

- ❖ **Read I Chronicles 29:11-13, Ps. 24:1, 1 Cor. 6:19-20**
 - What is ownership?
 - By what right(s) does God have to claim ownership? (Hint: There are a few in these passages.)
 - What should your response be to God's ownership?
 - What are some inadequate responses that we often make?
- ❖ **Re-read 2 Cor. 8:1-21 and answer/discuss the following questions.**
 - Why is it significant that the Macedonian churches are used by Paul for comparison purposes?
 - How should the context of the Macedonian churches and modern churches in Third World countries today inform and influence our stewardship?
 - The average evangelical Christian contributes less to their church and the Kingdom today than our counterparts during the Great Depression as a percentage of their income.
 - We are wealthier but less generous than previous generations. Why do you think this is the case?
 - What would generosity look like today in our context?
 - If God were to look at your calendar would He say you are generous with your time towards Him and His Kingdom?
 - If God were to look at your checkbook, would He say you are generous with your money towards Him and His Kingdom?
 - Discuss the point made in verses 5-9 that "Generous Stewardship is the fruit of true worship and genuine conversion". Do you agree or not with this point? How is stewardship the fruit of true worship? Why would Paul link it to genuine conversion (e.g., vs 8 "prove... that your love also is genuine")?
 - How does the title of "Lord" in verse 9 impact Biblical Stewardship and our response to it?
