The Faith Advantage Part 2: Acceptance Romans 8:5-13

Getting Started

- ❖ Dr. Randy Pope started us off in this series of messages by stressing that we know we are accepted because of the testimony of God's Word. What phrases or words or ideas in Romans 8:1-4 communicate this to you?
- ❖ Do you ever feel under "condemnation"? What causes you to feel this way and how will you make sure you remember "there is now no condemnation" next time?
- Opening Prayer Time: Share with one another the obstacles you experience in your sanctification. Pray for one another that God would give us the grace we need to overcome these obstacles through the Holy Spirit's power.

Digging Deeper

- * Reread and discuss Romans 8:5-13.
 - This passage speaks quite a bit about the Holy Spirit. What words or phrases do you typically use to describe the Holy Spirit being present and at work in your life? When have you experienced those things in greatest measure?
 - o In Romans 8:5-8, Paul says that there are only two kinds of people: of the flesh and of the Spirit, with no neutral position. Given this teaching, how should we regard kind and loving non-Christians? How should we regard Christians who seem judgmental? How should this affect our relationships with Christians and non-Christians?
 - o Identify the phrases and concepts in this passage that put the Trinity before us. How can seeing the gift of eternal life and our sanctification as a Triune work help us in our relationship with each Person of the Godhead?
- ❖ Read Mark 8:31-34; Col. 3:1-4; Phil. 4:8. How do these passages encourage us to think according to the Spirit?

Applying this sermon to Our Lives

- Jerry gave three application points from verses 12-13 under the labels of Recognize, Resist and Rely. Discuss with each other the biblical truths behind these points. Which of these points do you see most clearly in your life and which do you struggle with the most?
- What do you do with your solitude and "down-time"? How will you fix your thoughts on the gospel today?

- Eph. 1:13-14--- The Holy Spirit is the "down-payment" of our inheritance.
- Acts 1:8--- The Holy Spirit is the source of spiritual power so we can serve our Lord.
- John 14:15-17, 26--- The Holy Spirit is our "helper" and "teacher".
- Isaiah 11:2-3--- The Holy Spirit give us wisdom.
- 1 Cor. 6:19-20--- The Holy Spirit lives within us.
